A CRITICAL REFLECTION PROGRAM FOR CLINICAL STUDENTS

Clare Delany will present relevant findings from research recently conducted for the DHS Clinical Placement Innovation Projects Strategy, involving third-year University of Melbourne undergraduate physiotherapy students.

Dr Delany investigated the experiences and perspectives of both educators and students around teaching and learning during clinical placements. After introducing a six-week critical reflection program for clinical students, Dr Delany developed a framework to enhance effectiveness and capacity in clinical education.

Many of the issues investigated by the project and the findings of the research are relevant to medical students and educators. There will be ample opportunity for discussion and questions following the presentation.

Dr Clare Delany is a senior lecturer in ethics, law and qualitative research methods at the School of Physiotherapy, The University of Melbourne and the Faculty of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences, Monash University (Medicine). Clare's research interests and experience are in legal and ethical obligations of health practitioners; critical reflection in clinical education; healthcare communication and implementing ethical theory into clinical practice.
