This seminar will provide an opportunity to explore some of the issues facing the Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences as the University moves to the Melbourne Model. As we design and develop postgraduate courses to follow on from those we currently conduct, what are the major issues and what are some of the approaches we might take? In particular, Professor Rangachari will consider the promises and pitfalls of trying to keep students engaged and promoting student-centred learning in a standards-based world.

Those involved in the development of the postgraduate courses will find this seminar particularly relevant and are strongly encouraged to attend.

Professor P.K.Rangachari is a pharmacologist and Emeritus Professor of Medicine at McMaster University, Ontario, Canada. Familiar with the issues associated with curriculum design and integrating the sciences into a medical course, Professor Rangachari has designed several courses at McMaster. He has also conducted workshops on PBL in several countries, and assisted with those that are held at McMaster University under the auspices of the Programme for Faculty Development.
