Dr Jane Prosser will present relevant findings from her recent research, which was undertaken as part of a project to produce new DVDs demonstrating clinical examination techniques for medical students. Dr Prosser investigated published evidence that studied the performance of the clinical neurological examination as a diagnostic test. She used this to produce a focussed questionnaire examining opinions of practising neurologists on the content and structure of the neurological exam that is taught to medical students.

Many of the issues investigated by the project and the findings of the research are relevant to medical students and educators. There will be ample opportunity for discussion and questions following the presentation.
