Based on her PhD research, Elizabeth Molloy will highlight common practices in feedback in clinical education and present a framework for effective feedback practice. She will discuss the framework, the premise on which it is based, some of the consequences of productive feedback conversations between students and clinical educators. The session will provide a forum for participants to discuss opportunities for maximising feedback opportunities and to practice strategies outlined in the 'feedback framework' through role-play.
