Just what are the implications of our ageing population on health care? How can we prepare our future doctors for working with the many older patients they will meet in their working life?

In this seminar, Dr Jenny Schwarz will talk about the pernicious affect of ageism in our society and other issues relating to ageing. She will provide some insights into how geriatricians approach patient problems, and some of the common barriers faced when teaching students about chronic disease. The session will provide an opportunity to discuss ways in which concepts around ageing might be incorporated into the new University of Melbourne Graduate Medical Course.
